VISITING SCHOLARS PROGRAM

The University of Illinois College of Law's Visiting Scholars program provides an opportunity for qualified individuals to conduct independent research in a law school setting. Visits can be for any duration although a minimum of four months is recommended. All visiting scholar applications will be evaluated based on credentials, space, access to research materials to support the proposed project, and faculty availability.

Each scholar is provided a faculty host, an opportunity to audit law courses, and access to library and research tools (including unlimited LexisNexis, Westlaw and Bloomberg databases). Visiting scholars also have access to the College of Law's facilities, and are provided with a semi-private work space with a desk and access to printer capabilities within the building. Visiting scholars may have the opportunity to present their research to the College of Law community through our International Workshop Program. Others may choose to take English language classes on campus.

Scholars must be self-funded to support their cost of living and the program fee. While we are no longer able to waive the full fee, partial scholarships are available. Applications are accepted year-round. Visit our website for more information.
